Series: Stanford leads 36-1



OPENING SPRINT

The Big West champion University of Hawaii women's water polo team will face top-seeded Stanford in the semifinals of National Collegiate Water Polo Championship on May 10 in Indianapolis.

- The Rainbow Wahine defeated California 8-7 in the quarterfinals on Friday to advance to the NCAA Championship semifinals for the second straight year and the sixth time overall.
- UH is seeking its first berth in the national title game in program history.
- UH sophomore Daisy Logtens made 12 saves in the win over Cal, the second highest total in an NCAA tournament match in program history.
- UH got two goals each from Bernadette Doyle, Jordan Wedderburn, Alia Burlock and Ema Vernoux to account for the 'Bows' scoring.
- UH and Stanford meet for the second time this season. The Cardinal posted a 12-7 win over the 'Bows in the Fresno State Polopalooza on Jan. 18 in the opening weekend of the season.
- UH earned the No. 4 seed in the nine-team bracket after claiming the Big West title for a second straight year. Logtens was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player with 29 saves (61.7% SV) and two steals and an assist.
- The Rainbow Wahine are making the program's ninth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and earned back-to-back berths for the first time since 2005 and '06.
- Ema Vernoux leads UH with 77 goals, the fourth highest single-season total in program history, and 97 points.
- Bernadette Doyle, the Big West Player of the Year, is second on the team in points (93) and leads the 'Bows in assists (38) and steals (53).

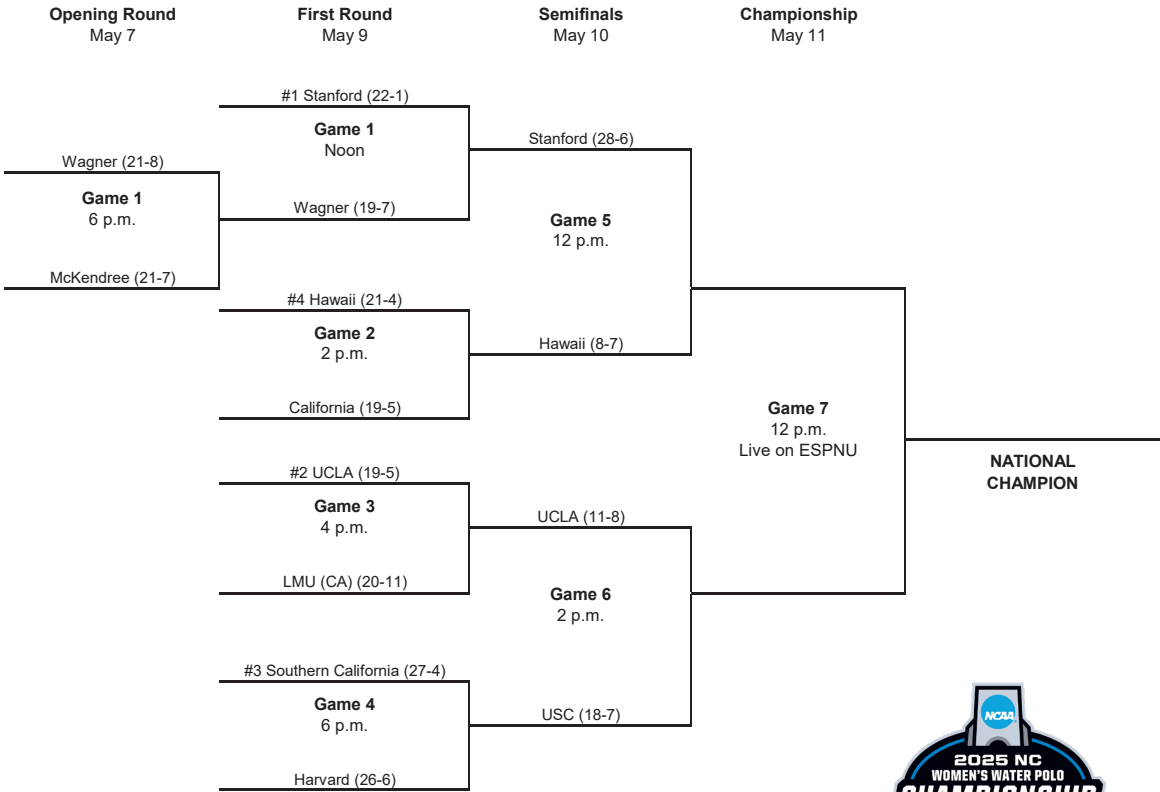

THE MATCHUP

STANFORD CARDINAL

Series record: Stanford leads 36-1

Last meeting: Stanford 12, Hawai'i 7
Jan. 18, 2025; Fresno, Calif.

- UH is 1-36 all-time against Stanford, including 0-2 in the NC Women's Water Polo Championship with losses in 2005 and '09, both coming in the third-place match.
- UH and Stanford meet for the second time this season. The Cardinal posted a 12-7 win over the 'Bows in the Fresno State Polopalooza on Jan. 18 in the opening weekend of the season.
- UH earned its first win in the all-time series with the Cardinal last season, 9-7 in overtime on Jan. 20, 2024 in the Polopalooza in Fresno, Calif.
- Stanford was awarded the top seed in the NCAA tournament bracket after winning the MPSF Championship.
- Stanford is the only program to have participated in all 24 NCAA Championships and is seeking its 10th national title.
- John Tanner is in his 28th season as Stanford's head coach. He's led the Cardinal to nine NCAA titles and was inducted into the USA Water Polo Hall of Fame in 2019.
- The Cardinal opened this year's NCAA Championship by tying the program's scoring record in a 28-6 win over Wagner in the quarterfinals on Friday. Five players had hat tricks for Stanford.
- Jenna Flynn leads Stanford with 60 goals followed by Ryann Neushul with 58 and Jewel Roemer with 45. All three were members of the 2024 U.S. Olympic team.
- Christine Carpenter has 150 saves in goal for the Cardinal.

The Rainbow Wahine are making the program's ninth appearance in the National Collegiate Women's Water Polo Championship and earned back-to-back berths for the first time since 2005 and '06.

- UH is now 7-13 all-time in the NCAA Championship, including 6-3 in first-round games.
- UH entered the week 3-4 against teams in the bracket this season (Stanford, 0-1; Loyola Marymount, 1-0; USC, 0-2; California, 1-0; UCLA, 1-1).
- UH defeated Princeton in the quarterfinals of last year's NCAA tournament held at Cal's Spieker Aquatics Center in Berkeley, Calif. The 'Bows then ended the season with a 9-6 loss to the Bears in the semifinals.
- The 2024 Rainbow Wahine advanced to the NCAA semifinals for the first time since 2013.
- UH senior Bernadette Doyle is making her third appearance in the NCAA Championship. She was part of the 2019 team that lost to Cal 17-13 in the quarterfinals at Stanford, Calif. After spending a couple of years away from the program, she returned to UH last year had a hat trick against the Bears in last year's meeting.

'BOWS CLAIM SECOND STRAIGHT BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP

The top-seeded Rainbow Wahine swept through the Big West Championship held April 25-27 at the Anteater Aquatic Complex in Irvine, Calif., to claim the conference title for the second straight year and the sixth time overall.

April 25 — Quarterfinals

Hawai'i 16, Cal State Fullerton 6

- Seven UH players scored at least two goals led by Jordan Wedderburn's 13th hat trick of the season.
- Bernadette Doyle scored two goals and posted an assist to become the second player in program history to reach triple digits in career goals, assists and steals.
- Freshman Gabrielle Doyle scored twice and set a season high with four assists, one shy of the program's single-match record.
- Daisy Logtens made four saves in less than three quarters and Nalani Yim finished out the match in goal.

April 26 — Semifinals

Hawai'i 11, UC San Diego 9

- Bernadette Doyle tied her career-high with five goals in her 12th hat trick of the season and set a career best with eight steals to help fuel a win over the fourth-seeded Tritons.
- Doyle tied the third highest single-game steals total in program history, matching Karin van Hoff's eight against UCSD on Feb. 9, 2002, and finished two shy of the school record.
- Jordan Wedderburn posted her 14th hat trick of the season and second of the tournament and drew seven exclusions.
- Ema Vernoux added two goals and assisted on another.
- Daisy Logtens came up with 11 saves and helped seal the win in the final minutes.

April 27 — Championship

Hawai'i 8, Long Beach State 6

- Powered by a stifling defensive performance, the Rainbow Wahine claimed a second consecutive conference title with the win over the Beach.
- UH goalkeeper Daisy Logtens came up with 14 saves on her way to earning the tournament's Most Valuable Player award, and the Rainbow Wahine (21-4) claimed the Big West's automatic berth to the National Collegiate Women's Water Polo Championship with the program's sixth Big West Championship title.
- Seven UH players scored in the first half and the 'Bows shut out the second-seeded Beach over a span of 18 minutes, 24 seconds to take a 7-2 lead into the fourth quarter. LBSU made a push with four goals in the final period, but the 'Bows held off the Beach to celebrate back-to-back titles.
- Freshman Ema Vernoux converted two penalty shots, the second coming with 1:07 left to help UH fend off LBSU's comeback attempt in the 'Bows' 20th consecutive win in Big West regular-season and championship play.

RAINBOW WAHINE SWEEP TOP

BIG WEST HONORS

After claiming the conference regular season and championship titles, the University of Hawai'i women's water polo team swept the Big West's major awards and a total of seven members of the program received postseason recognition from the conference.

BERNADETTE DOYLE'S all-around performance earned the senior conference Player of the Year honors in voting of the league's coaches. **EMA VERNOUX**, the team's leading goal scorer, was named the Freshman of the Year, and **JAMES ROBINSON** was voted Coach of the Year in his first season leading the Rainbow Wahine.

Doyle and Vernoux, both attackers, also made the All-Big West First Team along with goalkeeper **DAISY LOGTENS**. Senior utility **JORDAN WEDDERBURN** was a second-team selection and junior attacker **RONI PERLMAN** earned honorable mention recognition. Vernoux and attacker **GABRIELLE DOYLE** also made the All-Freshman team.

BERNADETTE DOYLE

Senior • Atk • Auckland, New Zealand

Big West Player of the Year, All-Big West First Team

- Became the fifth UH student-athlete to be voted Big West Women's Water Polo Player of the Year and the Rainbow Wahine program claimed the honor for the seventh time in 12 years of conference membership.
- The left-hander ranked second on the team with 91 total points with 53 goals and a team-high 38 assists.
- She's also tied for the Big West lead with 51 steals and is second on the team with 13 field blocks.
- In Big West regular-season play, she led the conference with 37 points (19 goals, 18 assists) and tied for second with 14 steals.
- She has 12 hat tricks this season and posted a career game in the Big West Championship semifinals on April 26 when she tied her previous best with five goals and set a new high with eight steals in an 11-9 win over UC San Diego.
- Became just the second player in program history to post at least 100 goals, assists and steals in a career.

EMA VERNOUX

Freshman • Atk • Marseille, France

Big West Freshman of the Year, All-Big West First Team, All-Freshman Team

- Became the sixth UH player to be named Big West Freshman of the Year.
- Her total of 75 goals is the fourth highest single-season total in program history and she is on pace to become just the third UH player to average at least 3.0 goals per match in a season.
- Led the UH attack in volume and efficiency with a team-high 16 hat tricks and a .556 shooting percentage.

DAISY LOGTENS

Sophomore • GK • Uden, Netherlands

All-Big West First Team

- Made the All-Big West first-team for the second consecutive season.
- Led the conference with a 9.02 goals-against average and ranks fourth with 193 saves in her sophomore season.
- Named the Most Valuable Player of the Big West Championship after posting 14 saves in UH's 8-6 win over Long Beach State to capture the 'Bows' second straight title.

JORDAN WEDDERBURN

Senior • Util. • Johannesburg, South Africa

All-Big West Second Team

- Ranks second on the team 65 goals, tied for UH's eighth highest single-season total, and created power-play opportunities with a team-high 69 drawn exclusions.
- Has 14 hat tricks this season and scored a career-high seven goals in a win over UC Irvine on Feb. 2 in the Triton Invitational.
- In Big West matches, she led the team and ranked second in the conference with 22 goals.
- She tied program records with three Big West Player of the Week awards this season and four in her career.

RONI PERLMAN

Junior • Util. • Johannesburg, South Africa

All-Big West Honorable Mention

- Earned conference honors for the first time.
- Posted 32 assists to rank second on the team to go along with 15 goals.

GABRIELLE DOYLE

Freshman • Atk • Auckland, New Zealand

All-Freshman Team

- Joined the roster in January and ranks second on the team with 34 steals.
- Had a season-high four assists against Cal State Fullerton on April 25.
- She also has 14 goals and 10 assists.

JAMES ROBINSON

Big West Coach of the Year

- Ascended to head coach after two seasons as UH associate head coach under Maureen Cole and extended the 'Bows' Big West reign.
- After losing four of the team's top five scorers following the 2024 season, UH was voted second in the Big West preseason poll. The 'Bows' went on to sweep through the conference's regular-season schedule for the second straight year and retained the Big West Championship title.
- Guided the 'Bows' to their third straight 20-win season and 12th overall.



RAINBOW NOTES

WEDDERBURN EARNS JACK BONHAM AWARD

Rainbow Wahine senior Jordan Wedderburn was among three recipients of the 2025 Jack Bonham Award, the University of Hawai'i Athletics Department's highest individual honor.

- The award was presented to Wedderburn and Lily Wahinekapu of women's basketball as the female recipients. Brayden Schager of football was the male honoree at the 12th annual H Awards on April 30 at SimpliFi Arena at Stan Sheriff Center.
- The Jack Bonham Award is named for the late assistant athletics director who was killed in a plane crash in American Samoa in 1974. Bonham was returning to the islands from New Zealand where he was on a recruiting trip at the British Commonwealth Games.
- Established in 1974, the Bonham Award is given annually to the top male and female senior student-athlete who "best exemplifies the ideals for which Jack Bonham stood for in the areas of athletic excellence, academic achievement, public service, leadership and character."
- Wedderburn is the third water polo honoree and the second in the last three years, joining Andrea Nishioka (2001) and Emma van Rossum (2023).
- Wedderburn served as a team captain for South Africa's water polo team in the Tokyo Olympic Games before enrolling at UH and has ranked among the team's scoring leaders each of her four years while thriving in varying roles within the lineup.
- She further elevated her production as a senior, posting a career-high 65 goals entering the NCAA Championship to join UH's career top 10.
- She has helped UH claim three Big West regular-season titles with a 26-1 cumulative record in conference play, and back-to-back Big West Championship crowns.
- "Jordan has always been the spirit of the team, providing energy in a positive manner whenever the team needs it," UH water polo coach James Robinson said. "Jordan plays a role for this team that she never played before in her water polo career. Every year Jordan has had to make sacrifices and play a different role than she probably would like to, but she has never once complained. Jordan was a leader by example, and has always found ways to contribute in the biggest moments."
- Wedderburn holds a 3.78 grade-point average while majoring in kinesiology and entered her senior year as a two-time Academic All-Big West and ACWPC All-Academic honoree.
- She has served as a Student-Athlete Advisory Committee representative for two years and worked with Access Surf, helping those with physical or cognitive disabilities to swim or surf. She's also participated in Kōkua Learning Farm work days and with the Child Life Program, spending time with children going through treatment for retinoblastoma (an eye cancer) and their families.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

UH seniors Jordan Wedderburn and Bernadette Doyle have reached career milestones while ranking among the team leaders this season.

- Wedderburn ranks second on the team with 67 goals and ranks ninth in program history with 160 goals.
- Wedderburn became the second UH player to earn three Big West Player of the Week awards in a single season. Her four career awards tied the program's individual record.
- Wedderburn became the sixth UH player to score at least seven goals in a match when she netted seven against UC Irvine on Feb. 2.
- Doyle ranks fifth in program history with 103 assists and is eighth in steals with 131.
- Doyle became the second player in program history to reach triple digits in goals, assists and steals. She joined Paula Chillida Esforzado, who had 150 goals, 107 assists and 111 steals from 2013-15.

FRESHMAN SENSATION

Ema Vernoux has made an immediate impact in her freshman season with a team-high 77 goals this season.

- Her 77 goals the fourth highest single-season total in program history.
- She averages 2.96 goals per game and is threatening to become the third player to average three goals per match in a season.
- Vernoux has 16 hat tricks this season and has scored at least four goals in 10 matches.
- She set her season high with six goals against Arizona State on Jan. 25.

ON LOCKDOWN

Sophomore Daisy Logtens continues to rank among the Big West's stingiest goalkeepers while rising on UH's saves chart with 205 this season.

- She led the Big West with a 9.02 goals-against average.
- Logtens had 211 last year and is the first UH goalie to post at least 200 saves in back-to-back seasons since Meike De Nooy had 225 in 2006 and 242 in 2007.
- Her current 2025 saves total is the ninth highest single-season mark in program history.
- She became the sixth UH goalie to surpass 400 career saves and ranks fifth in program history with 416.
- She had double-digit saves in nine matches this season. She tied her career high with 15 against UC San Diego on April 10.
- She made 14 saves against Long Beach State in the Big West Championship final on April 27 and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

UH CLAIMS 6 BIG WEST

PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

UH claimed the Big West Women's Water Polo Player of the Week award six times this season to break the previous program record of five set last season. Last year, the 'Bows surpassed the previous high of four conference Player of the Week awards in 2013.

- Jordan Wedderburn earned her second Player of the Week award of the career on Feb. 5. Wedderburn scored a career-high seven goals in an overtime win over UC Irvine to punctuate a 15-goal weekend in the Triton Invitational.
- Freshman Ema Vernoux picked up her first award on Feb. 26 after scoring a team-high 14 goals over four matches at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational. She scored four goals in UH's historic 8-5 victory over No. 3 UCLA.
- Senior Bernadette Doyle earned the award on March 19 after posting a hat trick and scoring the game-winning goal in sudden death in a 9-8 overtime win over Long Beach State.
- Wedderburn won her second award of the season and third of her career on March 26 following a five-goal performance in a win over Pacific. Wedderburn scored three of her match-high five goals in the fourth quarter to help the 'Bows separate from the Tigers in a 15-8 win.
- Wedderburn posted her 10th hat trick of the season in her final home match to help UH defeat No. 7 UC Irvine 16-11 in overtime and picked up her third award on April 9.
- Doyle posted two hat tricks in a three-match road trip to earn her second award of the season and third of her career. She posted eight goals on 51.7% shooting, six assists and seven steals to help the 'Bows secure the Big West regular-season title outright.

DOYLE ON CUTINO WATCH LIST

Rainbow Wahine senior Bernadette Doyle was named to the Peter J. Cutino Award Watch List announced by USA Water Polo.

- The award recognizes the best player in men's and women's college water polo. This watch list was created in 2022 in an effort to help promote the college game, awareness of the honor, and the excellent play of athletes across the country.
- Doyle was among 20 players named to the watch list for the award named for the late Hall of Fame coach.

DEFEND THE DUKE

UH went undefeated at home for the second consecutive season, finishing 7-0 at the Duke Kahanamoku Aquatic Complex in 2025.

- UH has won a program-record 16 consecutive home games in a streak that started on April 22, 2023 with a 12-8 win over UC Davis.
- The previous record was 12 straight home wins from March 23, 2019 to March 18, 2022.
- UH has gone undefeated at home four times since 2020 and is 35-4 at the DKAC over that span.

RAINBOW NOTES

START OF A NEW ERA

After two seasons as UH's top assistant, James Robinson makes his debut as Rainbow Wahine head coach this season. Robinson was selected to succeed Maureen Cole, who retired at the conclusion of UH's historic 2024 season, and is the fourth head coach to lead the 'Bows since the program was established in 1998. Joining Robinson on his inaugural coaching staff are associate head coach Candice Vorbeck and assistant coach Rebekka Williams.

- Robinson was named the 2024 Association of Collegiate Water Polo Coaches Women's Assistant/Associate Coach of the Year
- In his second season as UH associate head coach, he helped Maureen Cole lead the Rainbow Wahine to a 23-4 season and the highest ranking in program history
- The season was highlighted by two wins over teams ranked No. 1 in the country (Stanford and USC) and a perfect run through the Big West regular-season schedule and conference tournament
- The Rainbow Wahine made the program's first appearance in the Women's National Collegiate Water Polo Championship since 2021 and advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 2013
- UH is 65-14 overall and 20-1 in Big West play during Robinson's tenure with the Rainbow Wahine coaching staff
- Robinson is a graduate of UCLA and was a member of three national championship teams with the Bruins (2014, '15 and '17)
- He played professionally with the Hunter Hurricanes in Australia and began his coaching career in 2018, working at both the club and high school levels in New Zealand.

OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

Junior utility Camille Radosavljevic and freshman attacker Ema Vernoux in their first season as UH teammates, but it isn't their first time playing together. After spending the past several years as teammates with France's national team, Radosavljevic and Vernoux helped make history in late July, representing the country in its long-awaited Olympic debut. Vernoux would go on to make even more history for France, scoring the nation's first ever goal in an Olympic women's water polo match.

- Radosavljevic played for UH in the 2022 and '23 seasons, remained in France for the 2024 season to prepare for the Olympics. Vernoux comes to UH from a prominent water polo family in France and helped the national team secure its best-ever finishes at the World Aquatics Championships.
- Senior Jordan Wedderburn competed in the 2020 Games in Tokyo with South Africa and served as team captain at just 18 years old.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The Rainbow Wahine again feature an international lineup with seven countries represented on the 21-player roster.

- UH's roster features 13 international players along with eight from the United States.
- Countries represented on this season's roster are Australia (one player), Canada (three), France (two), the Netherlands (three), New Zealand (three), South Africa (one), and the United States (eight).

'BOWS SECOND IN BIG WEST POLL

The defending Big West champion Rainbow Wahine placed second in the Big West Women's Water Polo Preseason Coaches' Poll, finishing just behind UC Irvine in the voting of the conference's eight coaches.

- UH went 23-4 overall last season and finished 7-0 in Big West play to capture the regular-season championship.
- The 'Bows then swept through the Big West Championship to earn the conference's automatic bid to the National Collegiate Women's Water Polo Championship. UH ended the season in the national semifinals and finished at No. 3 in the ACWPC and Collegiate Water Polo Association polls, the highest final ranking in program history.
- Senior attacker Bernadette Doyle and sophomore goalkeeper Daisy Logtens were among the seven players voted to the preseason all-conference team.
