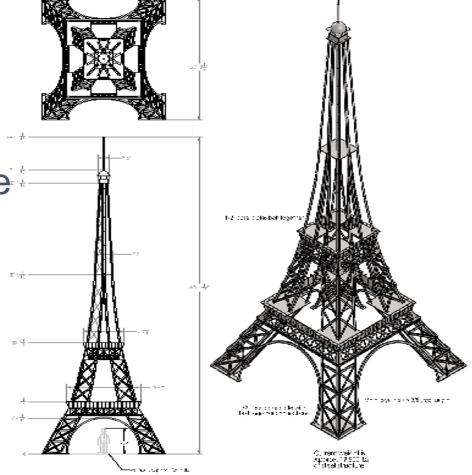

SUPER SERVICE

The Super Service program was developed for Super Bowl XVVI but was designed to be an ongoing destination management and customer service tool to be used by all Indiana hospitality employees. Hoosier Hospitality resonates within Indiana and a service standard has been set. Over 23,000 people have taken the program since its inception.

The intent is to use service as a strategy. In that way, guests; experience would be defined by the service they received. The training also ensures a consistent level of service throughout the state. By exceeding visitors' expectations the goal is to encourage return visits.





EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS

- Seek out and uncover guests' needs
- Establish rapport and gain trust
- Recommend experiences tailored to the guest
- View each person as a guest in your own home
- Encourage guests to return to Indy





LEARN

When facing guests who voice concern, this acronym will help your interaction with the guest and instill patience and understanding.

LEARN is a five-step process that stands for:

Listen, Empathize, Apologize, React, Notify

Guests who do voice a concern should not be seen as an adversary but rather a partner. They are giving you the opportunity to make something right; they trust you.





HUMAN TRAFFICKING RED FLAGS

- Inability to speak to individual alone
- Acts as if instructed by another, as though they are forced or coerced to carry out specific activities
- Not in control of their own identification
- Signs of physical abuse and/or refusing to make eye contact
- Branding or tattoos





HUMAN TRAFFICKING – WHAT TO DO

- Do not attempt to rescue a trafficking victim these situations can be very dangerous

COALITION FOR HOMELESSNESS INTERVENTION & PREVENTION (CHIP)

- 1,600 individuals experience homelessness in Indianapolis on a given day
- 20% of those experiencing homelessness are unsheltered staying outside or in places not meant for human habitation
- Lack of affordable housing and housing access drive homelessness





CHIP - WHAT TO DO

- If someone asks you for something, it is ok to smile, politely say no and continue on
- If someone needs assistance or you want to engage a street outreach team, call the Volunteer Hotline at (463) 207-9034 to request an outreach response
- If you are concerned about an individual's health or safety, please contact the Volunteer Hotline
- Be compassionate, be consistent, be aware, and be safe

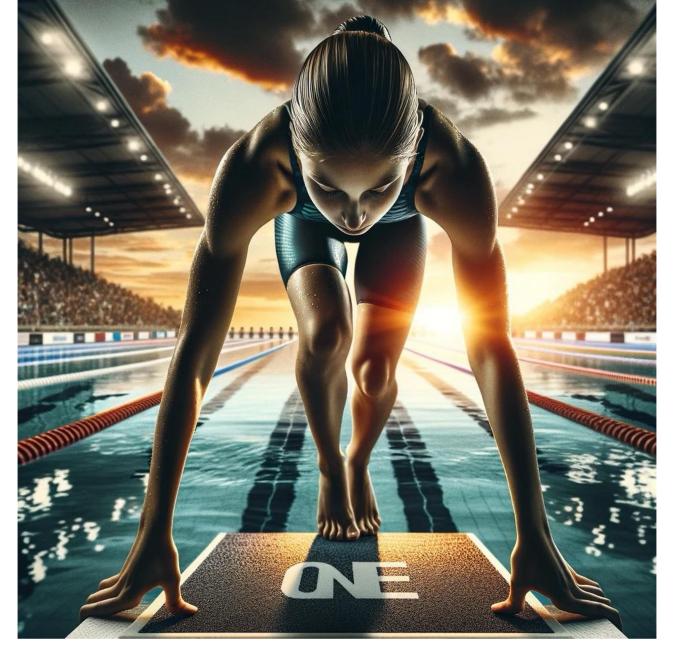
